## Pastor's Perspective

### Insuring that Liberty Remains a Blessing

*"When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness." (Romans 6:20)*

For Moravians living in the U.S.A. two occasions, our nation's Independence Day on the 4<sup>th</sup> and the commemoration of Jan Hus' martyrdom on the 6<sup>th</sup>, make July a month to reflect on the cost, value, and nature of freedom.

As we celebrate the many blessings brought about by political and religious freedom this month it's easy to forget the high price others paid to secure these liberties for us. Around twenty-five thousand died during the American Revolution to secure the freedoms enshrined in the Declaration and Bill of Rights. Jan Hus was burned to death on July 6, 1415 after being condemned as a heretic by the Council of Constance. Hus ran afoul of church hierarchy for insisting that clergy be morally upright and free of corruption, for denouncing the sale of indulgences as a fraud, and insisting that Christ, rather than the Pope was the head of the Church. Clearly, both Hus and the American revolutionaries believed life itself was not too high a price to pay for political or religious liberty.

In light of their sacrifice it's easy to see why many persons assume that freedom must be intrinsically good. Unfortunately this is not the case. Freedom is what we make of it. Freedom creates the conditions for us to worship God as we please and work towards a more just and abundant world; it does not assure that we will reach these desirable goals.

In the United States we cherish the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Too often though, persons mistake liberty for license. We and our fellow citizens sometimes conveniently forget that responsibility should be the handmaid of independence. A society in which persons are free of moral restraint and at liberty not to care for the less fortunate is more reflective of hell than heaven. There are other tyrannies more spiritually corrosive than political tyranny, and among them is the tyranny of a narcissistic, pleasure-addicted society in which individuals pursue their own self interest without regard for others or for future generations.

Thanks to Hus and the patriots of the American Revolution we are free to choose the type society in which we, our neighbors, our children and our grandchildren will live. Let us pray we choose wisely as we pursue the blessings for ourselves and others made possible by freedom.

Pastor Carol graduated from Moravian Theological Seminary in 1990 and was ordained into the Moravian ministry on June 6, 1991. She served the First United Church of Christ in Hellertown, first as director of Christian education, and then as associate pastor. On March 14, 1993 Carol was installed as pastor of College Hill Moravian Church where she served until February, 2006 when she became the first full time chaplain at Moravian Village.

Carol has been very involved over the years with Cursillo and ShareCare Faith in Action, serving as its president. Following her retirement this month, she and Keith will be relocating to Lancaster where they have a home, and becoming involved in the Lancaster Moravian Church community. ## PENTECOST MOBILE

Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

### What you need:

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line



### What you do:

1. Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
2. "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
3. Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
4. Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
5. On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
6. Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
7. Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
8. Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.

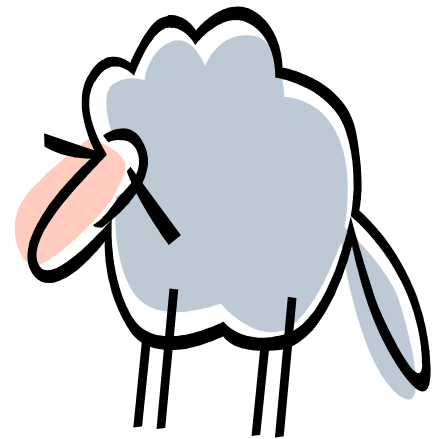

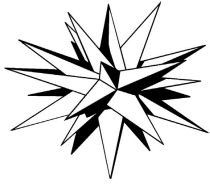
