When I was a little kid I could go into my backyard at night and see the starry band of the Milky Way galaxy stretched out across the sky. Yet before I reached high school, light from the city, local ball parks, and newly lit Interstate exchanges had bleached out the night sky. Only the moon and the brightest stars were visible through this "light pollution."

The Gospel of John uses the metaphor of light to describe Christ's victory over the world's sin and suffering: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (1:5) This is a statement of faith that even when circumstances prevent us from feeling God's presence, God remains with us.

Christians have long known that painful experiences can "dim" one's perception of God. Yet even wholesome interests and activities can become a source of "spiritual light pollution" when they distract us from God. The problem is not the interests and activities themselves, it is their relative importance in our lives.

Each of the stars in the Milky Way is millions of times brighter than any of the lights on earth that wash out the stars' light in the night sky. Yet the lights on earth are closer to us – and so they appear brighter. We cannot move ourselves closer to the stars but we can move ourselves closer to God. We can insure that none of our interests or activities in closer to our "center" than the light of Christ which shines in the darkness.

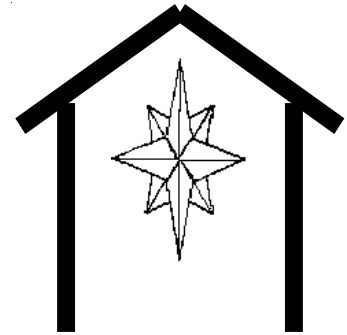

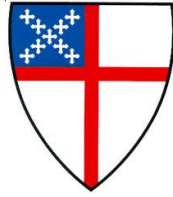

2011 Annual BAM Meeting

In response to an opportunity for improvement identified in its annual self-assessment, the BAM Board of Directors undertook a communications initiative in 2010. The objective was to provide information to members of the six congregations about the BAM organization. In addition to articles in your newsletters, the Board has provided informational brochures to each church for distribution, met with the Boards of Elders and Trustees at each of the six member churches, and in general increased engagement with members in order to answer the question "What's BAM?"

This year, the BAM Annual Meeting will be held February 15, 2011 at 7:30 pm at West Side Moravian Church. All BAM members are welcome and encouraged to attend.

The agenda for the meeting is prescribed by the BAM bylaws. Key elements include the following:

- Annual BAM Reports – This includes overviews of BAM operations, including Moravian Development Corporation (MDC), Moravian Village of Bethlehem (MVB) and Moravian College Housing (MCH), a report from the Ministries Committee and a financial overview.
- Reports from Related Organizations — Reports from related organizations provide an important opportunity to hear about developments in our Moravian community. Last year, reports were provided by the following groups: Moravian Museum of Bethlehem, Historic Bethlehem Partnership, The Moravian Archives, Moravian Music Foundation, Moravian Academy, Moravian Trombone Choir and the Northeast PA Moravian Mission Society.
- General Business – This year's meeting will include consideration of a proposed revision to the BAM bylaws. An overview of the proposed changes was included in an earlier article. The evolution of the proposed bylaws is as follows:
 - Over time, BAM's focus has changed from managing a few rental properties and endowments to a very complex housing and medical service organization. This growth over the last 16 years necessitated a restructuring of the organization, which was recommended by a steering committee appointed by the BAM board in 2006.

- Bylaws and boards of directors were established for MDC, MVB and MHC to ensure effective governance of operations. As the “Sole Member” of each of these corporations, BAM retains ultimate authority over the respective boards, to ensure that operations of the subentities are carried out consistent with the BAM mission.
- Following legal review and further deliberation, the steering committee was expanded and tasked with developing proposed revisions to the BAM bylaws.
- These changes were subsequently considered and approved by the BAM board, and are now presented to the general BAM membership for approval.
- Election of At-Large Members — This year's meeting will include election of two at-large members. The board is currently composed of the Senior Pastor of Central Moravian Church; six lay members, each of whom is elected by one of the churches belonging to BAM, two pastors serving BAM congregations, elected by the Board of Directors upon nomination by the Pastors Committee; and five lay members elected at the annual meeting upon nomination by the Board of Directors.
