Is the End is Near?

"But in those days ... stars will be falling from heaven ..."

Mark 13: 24-25

The text above happens to be this year's Gospel lesson for the first Sunday of Advent. Too often we consider such texts only in light of sensational claims like that of Harold Camping, who earlier this year claimed the world would end on 21 May.

Your pastor does not anticipate the end of the world anytime in the near future (i.e. 12/21/2012). Scripture tells us that not even the Son, but only the Father who is in heaven knows the day and hour of Christ's second coming (Mark 13:32). Come to worship on November 27 and discover the true spiritual value of such apocalyptic texts for 21st century Christians. Learn how we can live authentic lives of faith in challenging times.

Did you notice a change in The Star's masthead this month? It's a reference to the text from Mark's Gospel. More substantive changes continue inside, where Linda Wickmann has experimented with a simpler layout in which articles are presented in fewer columns. Worship highlights for the coming month are inside.

Jean Skillman plans and coordinates the Delectable Desserts section of the Faire and she spent part of her summer scanning cupcake and dessert books deciding what interesting goodies she was going to offer at her table.

In early September Jan Schanck was busy collecting all the flyers and donations from various businesses she had gone about requesting for the Goodie Bags for her group of volunteers to assemble.

Eileen Ackerman planned the breakfast she and John, Jr. and a crew prepared long before the day of the Faire, as did Bob Wingrove and his lunch crew.

SIGN OF THANKFULNESS

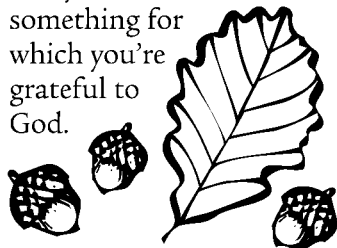
Create this festive sign, which will serve as a yearlong reminder to be grateful.

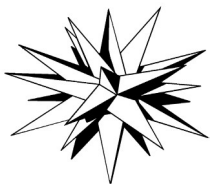
