Pastor's Perspective

Renewing Our Relationship With God

Persons sometimes ask me about re-affirming or renewing their wedding vows. From a theological perspective there's no need to renew your wedding vows unless you've died and risen from the dead. The clause in the Liturgy of Marriage ending in "so long as you both shall live" pretty much covers all other circumstances. Yet when I look at such requests from an emotional perspective I can sympathize with the desire for such a ceremony.

For some the reaffirmation of wedding vows is a way to reconnect with their younger selves and re-visit a pivotal moment in life. For others it is a chance to "get a fresh start" as they bring closure to a difficult period in their marriage. Still others wish to formalize a marriage that began with elopement or have the wedding ceremony they could not afford when they married. Finally, there are those who wish to mark a milestone of married life - a twenty-fifth or fiftieth anniversary. All are equally good reasons to celebrate one of the central relationships in a person's life.

Each September 16 Moravian clergy gather for worship on Ministers' Covenant Day. This is an opportunity for them to renew their vows of ordination - their pledge of service to God and God's Church. There is no theological reason for clergy to renew their ordination vows; there are plenty of emotional and spiritual ones. Many of the reasons clergy might wish to renew their ordination vows mirror reasons persons cite for wishing to renew their wedding vows. It is a chance to focus again on what called one into ministry, a chance to forgive and move on, or a chance to celebrate a decade or longer of faithful service to God and Church. Most of all it is an opportunity to celebrate the central relationship in each clergy person's life.

In the spirit of Ministers' Covenant Day I invite you to consider your relationship with God. Is it time for renewal or re-affirmation of your Confirmation vows? Have you reached a milestone in your life of faith that you wish to celebrate? Has your faith survived a fierce challenge? Are you struggling to make sense of your life? Perhaps it is time to find some way meaningful to you to renew your relationship with God. After all, Jesus Christ is always ready and willing to renew His relationship with you.

Walk from BETHLEHEM, PA to BETHLEHEM, ISRAEL - 5,092 miles, in just 12 weeks! The journey begins on Sunday, September 18 and we invite, in fact we encourage all of you to participate!

Participant information packets will be distributed on September 18, or you can print one out from our church website. Each packet contains age-appropriate spiritual and health information, a supply of mileage forms to use to report miles completed during the past week, and a discount coupon from Aardvark Sports Shop in downtown Bethlehem. There will be age-specific packets for the following groups: children (12 and under), teens (13 to 18), and adults (19 and over).

All ages are invited to take part, and a variety of activities can be used to generate mileage. A mileage conversion list for other activities is included in each packet. We will track our team progress on a map on the Health & Wellness Bulletin Board and report milestones regularly in church. Suggestions to make your journey comfortable, safe, and enjoyable are mentioned below.

*Everyone needs to sign up and get a participant number, so that we can properly track their miles. You can do this on September 18, or anytime by contacting Karen Davison, Kat Lehman, or Laura Kemmerer.

Rewards? There will be some special surprises for those who sign up early, and the individual with the greatest number of total equivalent miles in each age group will receive a prize. (We thank Aardvark for donating three \$25 gift certificates for that purpose and a number of discount coupons. Several members of our church family are also providing gifts.) ***But the best reward of all is the personal benefit that each participant will receive, in both spiritual growth and physical fitness.***

Here are some suggestions for our journey. Plan to walk with others - invite friends, neighbors, or family to join you, and make sure they sign up so we can benefit from their miles. Organize a walking group. Remember, everyone is invited to participate! Stretch before, during and after your activity; drink lots of water; start slowly and gradually increase pace, time, and distance. Wear appropriate clothing or gear, supportive walking shoes, helmets, lifevests, etc. Be sure to talk to your healthcare provider before beginning any new activity if you have existing health problems or need a medical OK. Stop your activity immediately if you develop any pain, cramps, or feel ill, and seek medical attention.

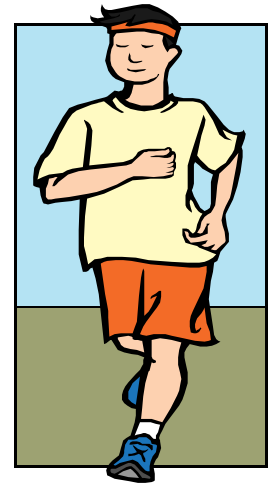

To help you measure your mileage, consider the following suggestions. Measure a specific distance with your car's odometer. Or time yourself (1 mile = approximately 20 minutes of moderately brisk walking, or 30 minutes of moderate walking). Or use mapmyrun.com, GPS systems on smartphones, or pedometers. Talk to Laura Kemmerer for help with walking conversions. Or time how long it takes you to walk 19 times around the perimeter of our Family Center. 19 laps = 1 mile. Turn your miles in weekly in church on Sundays, or by calling or emailing Karen Davison (610-317-0481, or karen@davison.net).

Use your activity time to focus on a special prayer concern, a thought for the day; this is a spiritual as well as a physical journey.

The Scoutmaster's Minute, by Jim Roberts, Scoutmaster of Troop 362

Every year Troop 362 attends Camp Minsi near Mt. Pocono for summer camp. This year there were 22 scouts attending all week, and 15 adults that stayed at camp for at least one night. The "first year" scouts work on rank advancement skills and relatively simple merit badges such as Woodcarving and Basketry, while older scouts may choose from the 50+ total merit badges offered, including Wilderness Survival, Cooking, Rifle Shooting, Small Boat Sailing, Archery, Athletics, Swimming, Environmental Science, Shotgun Shooting, Mammal Study, and Camping. Everyone enjoys a snack from the Trading Post (adults also!), and meals are served "family style" in the dining hall after a community grace, with scouts taking turns at being the waiter for their table. The troop members cook our own dinner on Thursday evening, as the kitchen staff has that night off. The weather cooperated this year, and everyone had a great time. Camp Minsi has a special "Scoutmaster Merit Badge" program for adult leaders to encourage participation; every Troop 362 adult in camp for the whole week earned their own Scoutmaster Merit Badge – the program has a total of 10 different sets of requirements for each of 10 years. In addition to rank advancement and merit badges, several scouts qualified for special awards from the various program areas. Of special note, Robert Buller, the Senior Patrol Leader qualified for the National Rifle Association Marksman Award in Shotgun --- the only scout to qualify our week. We look forward to another week at Camp Minsi next year. 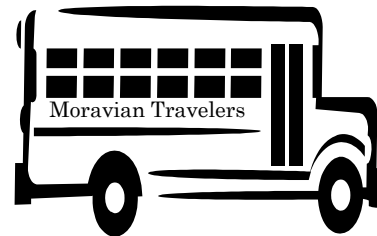

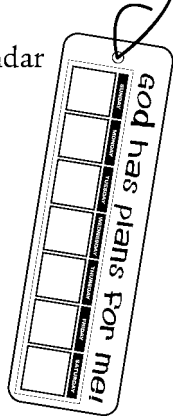

Make this bookmark to remind you that God is with you every day.

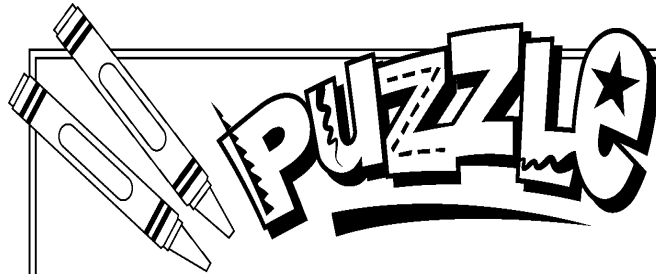
What you need:

What you do:

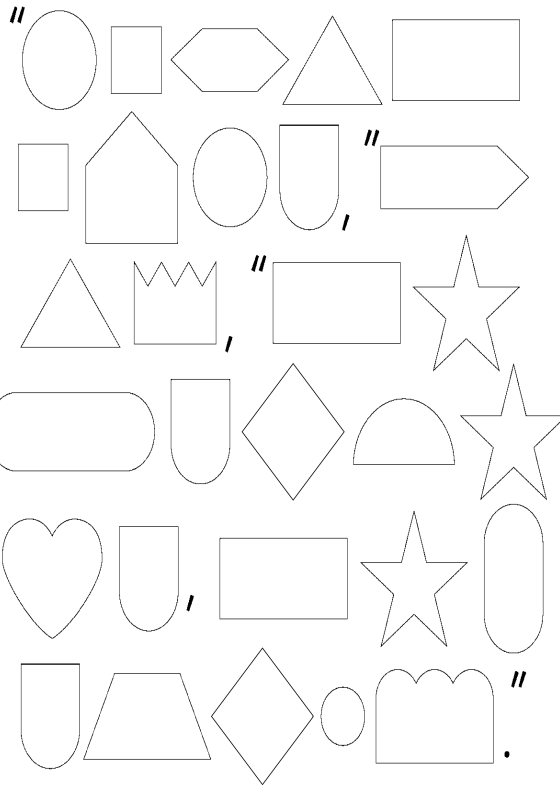
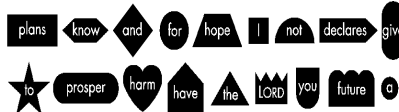
1. Cut out the first line of squares from an old calendar, including the days of the week along the top.

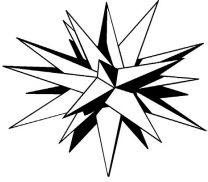
